

EARLY PERMANENCE: 2020/21-2023/24

The number and proportion of EP adoptions have increased from 14% (400n) in 2020/21 to 23% (676n) in 2023/24.




The number and proportion of ADMS, POs, Matches and Placements for children in an EP Placement have started to decline. In 2023/24, the proportion of ADMs granted for children in an EP placement decreased by **4** percentage points **(182n)**, an early indication that the number of EP adoptions is likely to decline.



In 2023/24 for a child in an EP Placement:


- the average time from entry into care to matched was **14 months**, **5 months** quicker for a child in an EP Placement, and **4 months** slower when compared to 2020/21
- the average time from entry into care to adoption was **20 months**, **10 months** quicker for a child in an EP Placement, and **3 months** slower when compared to 2020/21



The chart below shows the number and proportion of EP adoptions by Region.

In 2023/24, the South West had the highest proportion of EP adoptions at **31**%, and East Midlands had the lowest at **11**%.





The chart below shows the average time from entry into care to adoption for EP adoptions.


In 2023/24, the North East, South East and South West had the shortest average time from entry into care to adoption at **19 months**, and the West Midlands had the longest average time from entry into care to adoption at **24 months**.

The charts below show the breakdown of EP Adoptions by children's characteristics at placed in an EP placement, matched, and at adoption order. Since 2020/21:

- The average age of a child placed in, and matched in an EP Placement has increased
- The proportion of children with a harder to place characteristics has increased
- The proportion of children in a sibling group has increased
- The proportion of children with a disability has decreased
- The proportion of ethnic minority children with an EP adoption has increased
